# **Funding**

Successful bid for £1,000 from the Community fund for monthly activities.

Successful lottery bid for £11,000 to access counselling for members.

This bought us 400 hours of qualified counselling that can be used 1-1, group, virtual or face to face. This is so we can include fans that do not live locally.

We are using the hours as follows:

- Monthly adult group
- Counsellors present at all our events
- Weekly young person bereavement group (6 weeks holiday)
- 1-1 counselling.

We have 7 members currently receiving 1-1 counselling, and one family centred for a 7-year-old. Each person referred were contacted within 3 days of the referral and were allocated their counsellor within 1 week. The organisation has been amazing for those who have engaged, they tailor all their materials in the young people group to be football/Sunderland related.

# **Funeral Flags**

Our 4 coffin flags remain busy, we have 2 x old badge style and 2 new badge style.



### **Funeral flowers**

In addition to our flowers to loan we now have large funeral flowers in the shape of the old badge that can be loaned out to save families time and money.

The are made of artificial silk flowers and were mad possible by the donation of cash by Tom Lynns family after his passing. Flowers remain popular Toms badge was used for 7 funerals in the first 8 weeks of us having it.



**Pitch clippings** – new batch given by the groundsman.

We have provided almost 65 families with bottles / pouches of pitch clippings for funerals and many more of their family and friends with pitch clipping gifts.

We have held 2 workshops where families help make up the pitch clippings for future bereaved families as well as gifts for those left behind.



# Love bugs

Remains very popular for people visiting the memorial area, bugs are topped up weekly.

# Spreading of ashes

We have now supported 17 families with the spreading of their loved one's ashes, preparing the area, love bugs and arranging someone to be there with them. We have 7 families current waiting to hear what is happening with the memorial area.

We have struggled to engage with the club since our proposal of an expansion of the memorial area. Particularly in the last 6 months and we were asked to take a post down from our group stating we were upsetting fans. Although, at the end of last season the club announced they did plan to do work on the area. Some families were told July, then August then that it would be unveiled before the Burnley at home game. I tried to reach out to David Bruce and Chris Waters with no reply.

This was all very frustrating, but we did have it confirmed by Chris Waters we can still place memory pebbles and keep our love bug box at the memorial area.


# Talk in with Malcom Crosby at Sunderland deaf club (120 people)

Malcom has kindly agreed to come up to Sunderland on 8 November and he will be joined by Gordon Armstrong and Kevin Ball, hosted by Nick Barnes. We will have several BSL interpreters around the room to ensure accessibility for all.

We had no access to electricity, hot water, seating or toilets at the stadium and it was quite frustrating trying to organise. We do have members whose mobility is poor which restricts them from coming to the memorial area. The first year we had around 50 attends then around 120 last year, I'm sure this will rise again this year.
